NOPD Policing Data

NOPD policing data reports offer insight into investigations and policies regarding calls for service, field interviews, use of force, sexual assault, domestic violence, community engagement, crisis intervention and more.

Calls for Service ▼

Calls For Service are the events captured in NOPD's Computer-Aided Dispatch (CAD) system used to facilitate incident response.

Stop and Search (Field Interview Cards) ▼

The purpose of these reports is to summarize the stop and search data collected for the past year, analyze that data, and articulate the steps taken to correct any problems identified or to build on success.

Electronic Police Reports ▼

All Police Reports filed by NOPD officers including incident and supplemental reports containing the item number, location, disposition, signal, charges, offender race, offender gender, offender age, victim age, victim gender, and victim race. Police Reports can be updated when subsequent information is determined as a result of an investigation. In order to protect the privacy of victims, addresses are shown at the block level.

Use of Force ▼

The New Orleans Police Department's policy is to value and preserve human life while exercising lawful authority to use force. New Orleans police officers are required to use the minimum amount of force that an objectively reasonable officer would use in light of the circumstances to effectively bring an incident or person under control, while protecting the lives of the officer and others.

Misconduct Complaints ▼

This dataset represents complaints of misconduct originated by a citizen either directly to NOPD or through the IPM or by an employee of the Police Department per NOPD Misconduct Complaint Intake and Investigation policy. This dataset includes reports of misconduct including initial reports that may be subject to change through the review process.

Body Camera Metadata ▼

This dataset represents the metadata related to body worn camera videos recorded by the New Orleans Police Department.

In-car Camera Metadata ▼

This dataset represents the metadata describing the process of moving in-car camera videos recorded by the New Orleans Police Department from the server to DVDs in order to free up storage space.

Crisis Intervention Team ▼

The Crisis Intervention Team program, which will train officers to properly assess and de-escalate incidents involving mental health crises, will begin in 2015. As such, there are no findings for 2014. NOPD will publish partial-year data in the 2015 Annual Report.

Bias-Free Policing ▼

The purpose of these reports is to “assess all NOPD programs, initiatives, and activities to ensure that [they are not] administered in a manner that discriminates against individuals on the basis of race, color, ethnicity, national origin, religion, gender, disability, sexual orientation, or gender identity.”

Sexual Assault ▼

NOPD agrees to train supervisors and investigators in the Sex Crimes unit in the proper definitions and application of “unfounded,” “false,” and “baseless” classifications in the context of sexual assault. The immediate supervisor in the Sex Crimes Unit and the Special Victims Section Commander shall closely review and approve in writing any decision to classify a report as “unfounded.” NOPD agrees to track each of these conclusions separately in NOPD's CCMS and publicly report them on at least a semi-annual basis

Domestic Violence ▼

NOPD agrees to track dispositions of domestic violence investigations, including arrests and acceptance or refusal by the DA. NOPD further agrees to make a reasonable effort to enter into Memoranda of Understanding with appropriate agencies to track information related to the outcomes of domestic violence cases, including whether the case was ultimately dismissed, resulted in a plea agreement, or tried,

Data Item	Description
NOPD_Item	The NOPD unique item number for the incident.
Type_	The NOPD Type associated with the call for service.
TypeText	The NOPD TypeText associated with the call for service.
Priority	The NOPD Priority associated with the call for service. Code 3 is considered the highest priority and is reserved for officer needs assistance. Code 2 are considered "emergency" calls for service. Code 1 are considered "non-emergency" calls for service. Code 0 calls do not require a police presence. Priorities are differentiated further using the letter designation with "A" being the highest priority within that level.
InitialType	The NOPD InitialType associated with the call for service.
InitialTypeText	The NOPD InitialTypeText associated with the call for service.
InitialPriority	The NOPD InitialPriority associated with the call for service. See Priority description for more information.
MapX	The NOPD MapX associated with the call for service. This is provided in state plane and obscured to protect the sensitivity of the data.
MapY	The NOPD MapY associated with the call for service. This is provided in state plane and obscured to protect the sensitivity of the data.
TimeCreate	The NOPD TimeCreate associated with the call for service. This is the time stamp of the create time of the incident in the CAD system.
TimeDispatch	The NOPD TimeDispatch associated with the call for service. This is the entered time by OPCD or NOPD when an officer was dispatched.
TimeArrive	The NOPD TimeArrive associated with the call for service. This is the entered time by OPCD or NOPD when an officer arrived.
TimeClosed	The NOPD TimeClosed associated with the call for service. This is the time stamp of the time the call was closed in the CAD system.
Disposition	The NOPD Disposition associated with the call for service.
DispositionText	The NOPD DispositionText associated with the call for service.
SelfInitiated	The NOPD SelfInitiated associated with the call for service. A call is considered self-initiated if the Officer generates the item in the field as opposed to responding to a 911 call.
Beat	The NOPD Beat associated with the call for service. This is the area within Orleans Parish that the call for service occurred. The first number is the NOPD District, the letter is the zone, and the numbers are the subzone.
Block_ Address	The BLOCK unique address number for the incident. The block address has been obscured to protect the sensitivity of the data.
Zip	The NOPD Zip associated with the call for service.
PoliceDistrict	The NOPD PoliceDistrict associated with the call for service.
Location	The NOPD Location associated with the call for service. The X,Y coordinates for the call for service obscured to protect the sensitivity of the data.
